We will post **information about the course** in the university's web-based learning platform, Lisam, e.g. the reading list, the course guide and the timetable. Literary studies are no doubt already fairly familiar to you at this stage, but a few words are in order about the language module. The latter basically focuses on analysing interaction in the English language classroom. For this you are required to work in pairs and do some recording of an English class, for which you will need to use your contacts with your teaching practice schools. As soon as you can, we strongly advise you to **contact your** *VFU* **schools to see whether you can make video recordings of an English class**. The only people to see the actual recordings will be you (your pair) and your teacher (selected clips only). The reason for the recordings is *not* to examine the quality of the teaching or the students' learning, but to analyse

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the interaction between students and between the students and the teacher (depending on what you record). You will also be writing a proper consent form for all participants, which will meet the four main requirements of the Swedish Research Foundation (*Vetenskapsrådet*):

- providing information about the purpose of the study,
- obtaining participants' consent,
- assuring participants of their anonymity and
- guaranteeing participants that you will only use the recordings for research purposes (your studies).

This is important information for both teacher and students, so that they will agree to being recorded. Your recording will need to be organised in advance for week 36.

In case you wish to begin your **preparations over the summer break**, the first book for the literature course will be:

Barnes, Julian. Flaubert's Parrot. 1984. London: Vintage, 2012. Print.

For your first literary seminar this is to be read against the background of chapter 3 ("The Author") of

Bennet, Andrew and Nicholas Royle. *Literature, Criticism and Theory*. 4th ed. Harlow: Longman, 2009. Print.

Otherwise, refer to the course reading list for the remaining books/readings.
