We post **information about the course** in the university’s web-based learning platform, Lisam, e.g. the reading list, the course guide and the timetable. After you have been accepted (*antagen*) on the course, you should receive direct access from 7 August here: https://liuonline.sharepoint.com/sites/763A51/763A51_2018HT_RJ (or via the general link to Lisam here: <http://lisam.liu.se>). However, to gain access you must have a LiU ID. If you don’t already have this, you need to create a temporary ID (see step 1 here: <https://liu.se/en/article/antagen-till-en-kurs> or in Swedish here: <https://liu.se/artikel/antagen-till-en-kurs>).

In the meantime, you will be able to access the **preliminary timetable** via TimeEdit from 16 July, by entering your course code (763A51) here: <https://se.timeedit.net/web/liu/db1/schema/>

In case you wish to begin your **preparations over the summer break**, one thing you can do is to get a copy of the main textbook we will use for the course (Ian Hutchby & Robin Wooffitt (2008). *Conversation Analysis*, 2nd ed. Cambridge: Polity.) and read the introductory chapter.

Otherwise, refer to the course reading list for the remaining books/articles.
