Intended learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the student should be able to:

- account for basic statistical inference methods and probability models
- apply statistical methods for analysis of data,
- interpret the results of statistical analyses,
- select and use basic sampling methods,

Course content

The aim of the course is that the student should acquire an overview of central concepts and points of view in statistics.

The following is studied in the course

- methodology for descriptive statistics,
- probability models of random variables,
- statistical inference with significance testing and interval estimation,
- simple random selection and stratified selection,
- statistical software.

Teaching and working methods

The teaching takes the form of lectures, teaching sessions, assisted problem solving and computer exercises. The students should also study independently.

Examination

The course is examined through a written examination.

Students failing an exam covering either the entire course or part of the course twice are entitled to have a new examiner appointed for the reexamination.

Students who have passed an examination may not retake it in order to improve their grades.
