## Intended learning outcomes

After completion of the course, the student should at an advanced level be able to

- independently prioritize, and evaluate information to perform a specific analytical assignment within Environmental Science
- systematically analyse, process and evaluate data in the analytical assignment and relate the analyse to relevant research
- communicate the process and results of the analytical assignment in writing

## Course content

The course is conducted as an individual internship at an external organization within the field of Environmental Science with focus to perform a relevant analytical assignment. The contact person at the external organization should design the assignment, in communication with the student, and support the student during the internship. The course supervisor must approve the assignment before the student commences the course.

## Teaching and working methods

The teaching and working methods are internship and individual writing of a report. The student is responsible for finding the external organization where the internship will be performed. The internship can be in Sweden or abroad.

## Examination

The course is examined through an individual written report and completed internship. Detailed information can be found in the course's study guide.

If the LiU coordinator for students with disabilities has granted a student the right to an adapted examination for a written examination in an examination hall, the student has the right to it. If the coordinator has instead recommended for the student an adapted examination or alternative form of examination, the examiner may grant this if the examiner assesses that it is possible, based on consideration of the course objectives.
