## Entry requirements

- 60 ECTS credits passed including at least 30 ECTS credits in Business Administration, or equivalent
- English corresponding to the level of English in Swedish upper secondary education (Engelska 6 or Engelska nivå 2)  
Exemption from Swedish

## Intended learning outcomes

The course aims to provide students with an understanding of sustainable entrepreneurship, along with the knowledge and skills to explore how new opportunities can be identified, developed, and implemented in ways that promote long-term economic, social, and environmental sustainability.

## Course content

The course covers fundamental concepts in entrepreneurship with a particular emphasis on sustainability. It includes the identification and development of business opportunities, theories on the dynamics of entrepreneurship, and practical approaches to creating and managing sustainable ventures. The course highlights both individual and organizational perspectives, as well as the challenges and paradoxes associated with sustainable entrepreneurship in various contexts.

## Teaching and working methods

The teaching is conducted online through lectures, seminars, project work, and work shops.

In addition to this, the student is expected to engage in self-study.

## Examination

The course is examined through:

- individual written examination, grading scale: Pass with Distinction/Pass/Fail
- group project work, grading scale: Pass/Fail

To obtain a final grade and pass the course, a minimum of Pass is required in all components. To obtain a Pass with Distinction, a Pass with Distinction is also required on the individual written examination.

Detailed information is available in the study guide.

If special circumstances prevail, and if it is possible with consideration of the nature of the compulsory component, the examiner may decide to replace the compulsory component with another equivalent component.

If the LiU coordinator for students with disabilities has granted a student the right to an adapted examination for a written examination in an examination hall, the student has the right to it.

If the coordinator has recommended for the student an adapted examination or alternative form of examination, the examiner may grant this if the examiner assesses that it is possible, based on consideration of the course objectives.

An examiner may also decide that an adapted examination or alternative form of examination if the examiner assessed that special circumstances prevail, and the examiner assesses that it is possible while maintaining the objectives of the course.

Students failing an exam covering either the entire course or part of the course twice are entitled to have a new examiner appointed for the reexamination.

Students who have passed an examination may not retake it in order to improve their grades.

## Other information

Planning and implementation of a course must take its starting point in the wording of the syllabus. The course evaluation included in each course must therefore take up the question how well the course agrees with the syllabus.

The course is conducted in such a way that there are equal opportunities with regard to sex, transgender identity or expression, ethnicity, religion or other belief, disability, sexual orientation and age.

If special circumstances prevail, the vice-chancellor may in a special decision specify the preconditions for temporary deviations from this course syllabus, and delegate the right to take such decisions.

### **About teaching and examination language**

The teaching language is presented in the Overview tab for each course. The examination language relates to the teaching language as follows:

- If teaching language is “Swedish”, the course as a whole could be given in Swedish, or partly, or as a whole, in English. Examination language is Swedish, but parts of the examination can be in English.
- If teaching language is “English”, the course as a whole is taught in English. Examination language is English.
- If teaching language is “Swedish/English”, the course as a whole will be taught in English if students without prior knowledge of the Swedish language participate. Examination language is Swedish or English depending on teaching language.
