Entry requirements

- 60 ECTS passed from undergraduate level
- English corresponding to the level of English in Swedish upper secondary education (Engelska 6) (Exemption from Swedish)

Intended learning outcomes

On completetion of the course, the student will be able to show rudimentary knowledge of both artistic interpretation and aesthetic expression in education.

Course content

The students will get possibilities to work with different aesthetic expressions and artistic methods, such as drama, fine arts and music that can be used especially in pre- and elementary schools.

The students will work in group and plan, rehearse, perform and then evaluate some kind of performance where different aesthetic expressions are combined.

Each student will by photos and words document his/her and the group's work with aesthetic expressions and artistic methods.

Teaching and working methods

As the course is based on active participation and laborative work by the students, high attendance at the classes are important. Between the classes, the students are expected to read the course literature and to prepare various tasks.



Examination

The course is examined through active participation in compulsory classes and through a performance where different aesthetic expressions are combined and also through an individually written portfolio that also includes documentation with photos.

Applies to all courses regardless of grading scale.

• Students failing an exam covering either the entire course or part of the course two times are entitled to have a new examiner appointed for the reexamination.

If the course has a three-graded grading scale (U - VG), following applies:

• Students who have passed an examination may not retake it in order to improve their grades.

If the course is a VfU course, the following applies:

• Examination of applied social and didactic abilities is limited to three (3) occasions.

The following applies to courses that include a compulsory component:

• If special circumstances prevail, and if it is possible with consideration of the nature of the compulsory component, the examiner may decide to replace the compulsory component with another equivalent component.

If the LiU coordinator for students with disabilities has granted a student the right to an adapted examination for a written examination in an examination hall, the student has the right to it. If the coordinator has instead recommended for the student an adapted examination or alternative form of examination, the examiner may grant this if the examiner assesses that it is possible, based on consideration of the course objectives.

Other information

Planning and implementation of a course must take its starting point in the wording of the syllabus. 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About teaching and examination language

The teaching language is presented in the Overview tab for each course. The examination language relates to the teaching language as follows:

- If teaching language is Swedish, the course as a whole or in large parts, is taught in Swedish. Please note that although teaching language is Swedish, parts of the course could be given in English. Examination language is Swedish.
- If teaching language is Swedish/English, the course as a whole will be taught in English if students without prior knowledge of the Swedish language participate. Examination language is Swedish or English (depending on teaching language).
- If teaching language is English, the course as a whole is taught in English. Examination language is English.
