# Intended learning outcomes

The aim of the course is to get fundamental knowledge in the production of still images and video, from planning to delivery. The course also covers the narrative and communicative properties of images as well as ethical consideration in for example image retouching.

The course covers mainly photographic still images and video, not illustration, animation or computer generated images.

After completing the course, students are expected to be able to

- Plan and execute the production of still images and video concerning image communication, narrative and dramaturgy.
- Implement fundamental principles of camera technic, photographic lightning and sound recording.
- Use digital tools and methods for image editing of still images and video.
- Deliver still images and video in format, compression and resolution suitable for different platforms.
- Value image narratives from a communicative and ethical perspective.



#### Course content

- Camera- and lighting technics.
- Sound recording.
- Digital photography and video recording.
- The purpose of image narrative and manipulation in a historical perspective.
- Dramaturgic storytelling with images and sound.
- Practical work in image editing and image manipulation.
- Practical work in editing of video and sound.
- Storage and distribution of images, videos and sound.
